

Details of the NHMRC Special Initiative in Mental Health Application Recommended for Funding Commencing in 2021

About the Scheme

The NHMRC Special Initiative in Mental Health (SIMH) will support a multidisciplinary and nationally focussed team to establish a national centre for innovation in mental health care as a collaborative network across Australia (involving key institutions, existing national networks in mental health and other relevant bodies).

The centre will undertake innovative, high quality implementation research to improve health outcomes and outlooks for people living with mental illness. It will operate as a virtual network coordinated by a single institution that will act as an administrative hub. The centre will include flagship programs to focus the network's activities on each of the identified research themes. Flagships, which may be based at participating institutions, would be open to a broad membership of researchers, clinicians, carers and consumers in mental health to facilitate innovative service delivery across Australia.

Funding Recommendations

The application listed in the table below was assessed against published criteria and found to be the most competitive out of the five applications received. The application is recommended for funding to commence in 2021.
