



NHMRC e-ASIA 2022 Joint Research Program applications recommended for funding commencing in 2023

About the Scheme

The NHMRC e-ASIA Joint Research Program (JRP) supports Australian participation and partnership in international collaborative research through the e-ASIA Joint Research Program. The e-ASIA Joint Research Program supports international joint research projects in the East Asia region on a multilateral basis and promotes the interaction of researchers through scientific workshops. Fields of cooperation are decided among the e-ASIA participating member organisations and funding is for up to three years.

International collaborative research projects are selected through an open call for proposals. The field of cooperation for this funding call was infectious diseases (including antimicrobial resistance). Applications must be supported by a minimum of three member organisations to be successful.

The applications listed in the table below have been approved for funding to commence in 2023. They are listed in application identification number (App ID) order.
