Translating Research into Practice Fellowships for funding commencing in 2014

The Translating Research into Practice (TRIP) Fellowships Scheme is a targeted award intended to build capacity in research translation by providing support for health care professionals, health care personnel and policy makers to undertake projects focussed on translating evidence into practice that will improve health care and public health.

The TRIP Fellowship is a part-time award (0.5FTE) which allows individuals to conduct a research translation project effectively in combination with their career.
